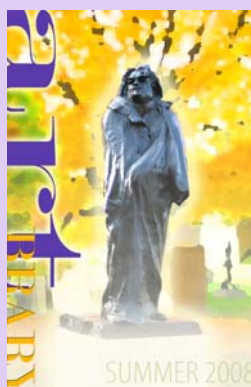

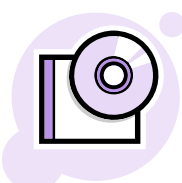

NEW-LOOK LIBRARY

DIRAC SCIENCE LIBRARY HAS SUMMER-TIME IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY

Strozier's not the only library undergoing renovation. Over the Summer semester, Dirac will be undergoing renovation to replace the carpet on the Main (2nd) Floor.

Other changes include:

- Two new group study rooms (on the main floor).
- The reference desk and new book reading areas will be changing places and have an updated look.
- Additional study tables will increase the study space available.

These renovations began in early May and will continue until the beginning of the Fall semester. In concession to the progress of the project, the Dirac Instruction Room will not be available

for class instruction but will remain open to the public for computer use. Study areas on the Dirac Main Floor will also be disrupted until late June as the project continues. Study areas on the first and third floors will remain available for library users.

Also due to the renovations, some materials shelved on the Main Floor have been moved to other areas. Anyone having difficulty locating any items should ask a staff member for assistance.

Once the carpet installation is complete, there will be upgrades to the visual and audio technology in the Instruction Room to provide a better learning experience.

The results will be worth the mess!
