Top 10 Things You Need to Know About FSU Libraries

1. **Subject Librarians** are your point of contact for library information, research and instruction support, and collection development.
2. **Data Librarians** can help you with finding and using research data, data visualization techniques, and research data management planning.
3. Our **Office of Digital Research & Scholarship** provides digital humanities instruction and project support as well as services related to open access publishing..
4. Consult with **Special Collections & Archives** staff regarding use of materials in class assignments, scholarship, research, and general inquiry.
5. We've gone beyond the physical library to integrate library resources and offer research support for our online and extended campus community with **Distance Library Services**.
6. **DigiNole: FSU's Research Repository** - A digital publishing platform for depositing scholarly works and data.
7. Register for Library Express Delivery and have your library materials sent directly to your departmental office. Or use our Curbside Pick Up service at Strozier Library for easy, contactless, materials delivery! **[Learn more here!](#)**
8. Request articles, books, and more from libraries around the world through **[InterLibrary Loan](#)**.
9. The University Libraries offer **[New Faculty Collection Development Grants](#)** to newly hired full-time tenure track faculty. These grants provide eligible faculty members with up to \$1,000 to order books and media materials for our permanent collection.
10. Faculty are invited to apply for the annual **[Robert B. Bradley Library Research Grants](#)** supporting the research and creative endeavors of faculty while developing world-class collections.

Research Resources

- **Digital Humanities** project support from development to data management & visualization to publishing digital editions.
- **Special Collections & Archives** - Consult with Special Collections & Archives librarians regarding use of materials in class assignments, scholarship, and general inquiry.
- **InterLibrary Loan** - Request articles, books, and more from libraries around the world via ILLiad – an Inter Library Loan Internet Access Database.
- Register for Library Express Delivery and have your library materials sent directly to your departmental office. Or use our Curbside Pick Up service at Strozier Library for easy, contactless, materials delivery! **[Learn more here!](#)**
- **UBORROW** - Request materials directly from participating libraries within Florida's state university and college systems.
- **Off Campus Access** - Many services and resources are accessible remotely, including research help.
- **Digital Library Center** - The Digital Library Center (DLC) provides assistance with digitization of materials, digital project management, metadata creation, and digital preservation.
- **Innovative Technologies** - Consultations are available on scholarly applications of 3D printing/scanning, virtual reality, GIS software, and audiovisual media analysis & annotation.

Instructional Resources

- **Instructional Materials** - Assistance finding teaching resources and implementing open or affordable instructional materials into courses.
- **Course Reserves** - Set up print or electronic materials and streaming media reserves for your courses.
- **Instruction and Training** - Instructors can request synchronous and asynchronous demonstrations, workshops, and instruction sessions on syllabus and assignment development, teaching digital tools in the classroom, and creating open educational resources.
- **Circulating Technology** - Check out equipment, download software, and access assistive technologies.
- **Canvas Support and Integration** - Embedded support in Canvas, including library resources and services tailored to your course or subject area.
- **GEOSET Studio** - Consultations and production for audiovisual projects related to teaching and research.

Publishing Resources

- **Florida State Open Publishing** provides publishing services for journals, monographs, open educational resources, and digital scholarship projects.
- **DigiNole: FSU's Research Repository** - A digital publishing platform for depositing scholarly works and data.
- **Copyright support** and consultations related to publishing agreements, IP ownership and licensing, and using copyrighted materials in teaching and research.

Subject Librarians

An FSU librarian is assigned to each department, school, and program who provides tailored instruction, research assistance, and collection building.

What can your subject librarian do for you?

- Serve as your first point of contact for information about library resources and services.
- Select and **purchase materials** to support your research and course curricula.
- Collaborate with you to design and facilitate **instruction sessions or workshops** to introduce learners to the major research methods and tools used in specific disciplines.
- Provide **research support** and help you navigate the Libraries' resources and find relevant information.
- Create **course guides** or comprehensive subject guides for your students.
- Provide support and **consultation** in areas such as citation management, plagiarism, and copyright.
- **Consultation Services** in data discovery, analysis, and management.
- Work with you to find **Open Educational Resources** for your instruction and for your students.
